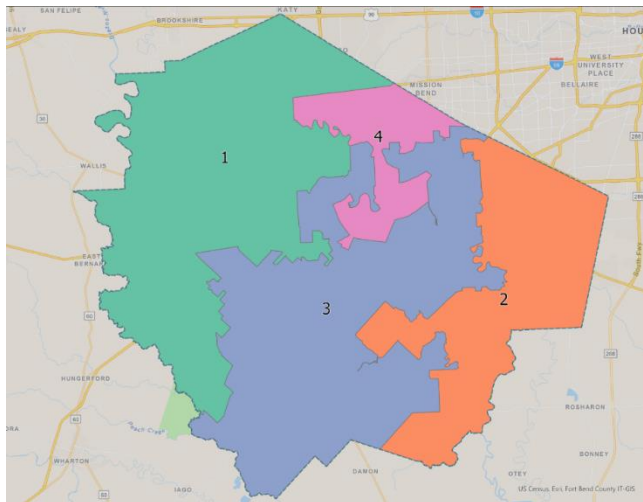

Fort Bend County Commissioners Court Approves New Precinct Map to Restore Fairness and Representation

RICHMOND, TX — In a decisive move aimed at restoring trust and balance in local government, the Fort Bend County Commissioners Court has officially adopted a new precinct map, replacing the 2021 map widely criticized for its partisan bias.

During today's special meeting, **County Judge KP George** called the new map a "correction of a wrong". He emphasized that the redistricting process was guided from the beginning by public input, legal oversight, and a deep commitment to fairness.

"The maps presented today — unlike those in 2021 — were shaped with full transparency, no added costs, and with the people's voice at the center," said Judge George. *"This process wasn't about power. It was about people."*



The newly adopted map, created with the support of a bipartisan **Citizens Advisory Committee**, ensures legal and equitable representation across the county. Under the approved boundaries, the Commissioners Court will reflect a balanced 2-2 political makeup, comprising two Republicans and two Democrats, thereby restoring what many believe to be the rightful balance of power in Fort Bend County.

The Judge also addressed misleading claims about the cost of redistricting, clarifying that the total expense related to the 2021 initiative was approximately **\$545,669**, not "millions," as some have stated. Additional construction costs related to courtroom space, exceeding \$1 million, were separate from the map-making process.

"Do not let political rhetoric distort the truth," said Judge George. *"This Court followed the law, included the public, and brought forward a fair and balanced map that respects every voice in our community."*

Despite political friction, **the Court-approved legal counsel, Rogers, Morris & Grover, worked closely with the Advisory Committee to develop the new map.** Judge George noted that the County Attorney’s refusal to authorize payment to this firm was based on flawed legal reasoning and should not distract from the legitimacy of the process.

“We are not breaking the law. We are breaking down barriers created by those who benefit from division,” the Judge said.

Today’s vote marks a turning point in Fort Bend County’s redistricting history, one that sets a precedent for **transparency, fairness, and local accountability.**
