Fort Bend County Sheriff's Office Celebrates Promotions and Awards

(FORT BEND COUNTY, TEXAS) – The Fort Bend County Sheriff's Office (FBCSO) recently recognized several men and women within the department for their commitment to public safety and excellence in service.

The Promotions and Awards Ceremony was held at the Gus George Law Enforcement Academy on Thursday, May 22, 2025.

Major Angel Rader currently serves as the Major of the Detention Bureau and has been a dedicated employee of the Fort Bend County Sheriff's Office for 29 years, beginning her career in May of 1996. Throughout her career, she has held various administrative and supervisory roles, including overseeing inmate records, transportation, budgeting, and jail operations. Major Rader holds numerous certifications, including Master-level Jailer and Peace Officer Licenses, a Jail Administrator License, and a Basic Instructor's License.

Captain Scott Soland, a 30-year Sheriff's Office veteran, leads Jail Operations. Since joining in 1992, he has served as Patrol and SWAT Commander and Jail Medical Services Lieutenant. A veteran of the U.S. Army and graduate of the FBI National Academy, he launched major initiatives, such as Regional SWAT Team, Crisis Intervention Team, and Justice Readiness Initiative. Recognized for his leadership in mental health and public safety, he has trained thousands of officers and received multiple honors, including the Lifetime Achievement Award.
