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Suspects Arrested in Multi-Agency Investigation of Houston-Area Aggravated Robberies

(Fort Bend County, Texas) - Three suspects have been arrested following a coordinated multi-agency investigation into seven aggravated robberies in the Houston area.

On August 7, 2026, Fort Bend County Sheriff's Office deputies responded to an aggravated robbery involving a food truck at 16,300 Bellaire Blvd and an armed robbery at a local business at 9200 Hwy 6 South. Investigators later determined the incidents were connected to similar robberies under investigation by the Houston Police Department and Harris County Sheriff's Office.

Investigators from each agency linked seven aggravated robberies across the Houston-area and coordinated their efforts, leading to the identity of the offenders as Francisco Alexis Rosales-Puente, 22; Wilfredo Perez, 21; and Ian Mohammed Dakkak, 19.

On August 18, 2026, with assistance of the Houston Police Tactical Surveillance Team and investigators of the Texas Department of Public Safety, Rosales-Puente and Perez were arrested. As the robbers were arrested, firearms and other evidence believed to be associated with the investigation were recovered. On September 1, 2026, the multi-agency collaboration led to the arrest of the third suspect, Mohammed Dakka.

Rosales-Puente and Dakkak have each been charged in Fort Bend County with Aggravated Robbery. At the time of this release, both remain in custody at the Fort Bend County Jail on \$300,000 bonds.

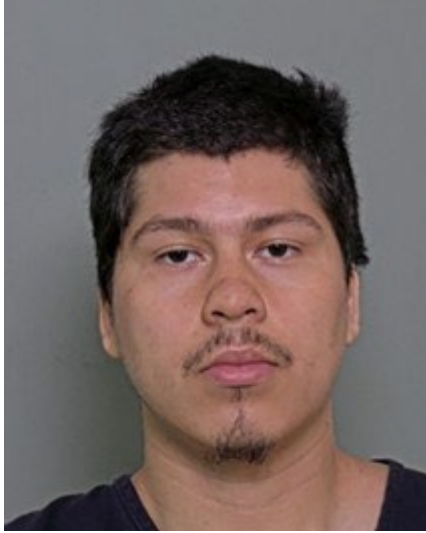
Perez has been charged in Harris County with three counts of Aggravated Robbery. At the time of this release, he remains in custody at the Harris County Jail on a \$110,000 bond.

“Violent offenders do not stop at jurisdictional boundaries, and neither will our efforts to hold them accountable,” said Sheriff Eric Fagan. “These arrests demonstrate what can be accomplished when law enforcement agencies share information, coordinate resources, and work toward a common goal. I commend the investigators and our partner agencies whose collaboration helped identify and apprehend these suspects.”

This remains an active and ongoing multi-agency investigation.
